Tips on Prayer:

Have a specific TIME: Make a daily appointment with God whether it's first thing in the morning, at lunch, or in the evening -and faithfully keep it.

Have a specific PLACE: Having a designated place to pray helps us remove distractions and frees us to worship and pray out loud.

Have a specific PLAN: As we pray every day, our plans for our prayer time can vary. Maybe it includes worship music, Bible reading and quiet time to listen to God. Maybe we follow a prayer outline like The Lord's Prayer, the Prayer of Jabez, or the Tabernacle Prayer. Perhaps we pray scripture. It doesn't always have to look the same; it just helps when we have a plan for regularly connecting with God.

Remember, Jesus never said if you pray instead, he said when you pray. This gives the expectation that you will pray.

WEEK 1: DO A NEW THING IN ME

DAY 1: Tuesday, JANUARY 11TH

Prayer Point: Create a New Heart in Me

Scripture Reading: Psalm 51; Ezekiel 11:19-20

Notes: Pray Psalm 51 from a posture of contrition and repentance. Ask God to give you a tender heart and walk in the grace for this next season that He has for you. Ask God to give you a willing spirit to say yes to whatever plans He has for you around the corner.

DAY 2: WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 12TH

Prayer Point: My Mind and My Thinking

Scripture Reading: Romans 12:1-2; Isaiah 55:8-13

Notes: Ask God to show you any areas of your beliefs that don't line up with His word. Ask the Holy Spirit to transform you by renewing your mind. Ask God to increase your faith to trust His word and a better understanding of His heart.

DAY 3: THURSDAY, JANUARY 13TH

Prayer Point: Help Me Be a Lover of Truth

Scripture Reading: John 17:17

Notes: Ask God to help us be lovers of truth. Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We have to love the truth to enter God's promises. The enemy of our soul is the father of lies. Ask the Father to help you love the truth and to understand that we can never do God's will through sinning.

DAY 4: FRIDAY, JANUARY 14TH

Prayer Point: Give Me a New Strength

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 40:31

Notes: Ask God for patience in the waiting areas. Pray for renewed strength, elevated perspective and the courage to rise above the circumstances in your life that are hard. Pray for the ability to discern how to act regarding each situation that you are facing.

DAY 5: SATURDAY, JANUARY 15TH

Prayer Point: Remove all Gossip from My Life

Scripture Reading: James 4:11-12

Notes: Ask God to make you aware of the words you speak and ask that they all be true, free of gossip or negativity. Pray that God would give you words of encouragement for the people around you and patience for anyone needing grace. Pray that you would see the people in your family, church, and work or school with the eyes of Christ and that you would speak of the blessing they are in your life.

DAY 6: SUNDAY, JANUARY 16TH

Prayer Point: Give Me a New Outpouring Scripture Reading: Joel 2:28-29; Acts 1:8

Notes: Pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit in your life. Ask God to give you divine dreams, vision and prophetic insight. Pray that RLC would bear a good witness and for revival of both heart and people in the days to come.

DAY 7: MONDAY, JANUARY 17TH

Prayer Point: A New Future

Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 29:11-14; Romans 5:1-5

Notes: Ask God to give you direction over any areas of your life that you are seeking clarity for your future. Ask God what his thoughts about your future look like in the areas of your dreams and desires. Ask God to give you perseverance to stand firm in the things that you feel like God has promised you and your family.

WEEK 2: DO A NEW THING IN MY CHURCH AND COMMUNITY

DAY 8: TUESDAY JANUARY 18TH

Prayer Point: Mental Health

Scripture Reading: Philippians 4:6-7

Notes: Pray for the people of Revival Life Church to walk in perfect mental health. Ask that God would create an environment of healing and wholeness in our community. Pray for God to give us discernment to see the people around us who need to hear the Gospel and receive the healing that comes from the Gospel.

DAY 9: WEDNESDAY JANUARY 19TH

Prayer Point: New Awareness

Scripture Reading: Nehemiah 1:4-11

Notes: Pray that your heart will be broken for the condition of people in our city. Pray for our church to "have a mind to work" to get involved in reaching people in our community and serving our church.

DAY 10: THURSDAY JANUARY 20TH

Prayer Point: Divine Appointments Scripture Reading: Luke 10:25-37

Notes: Ask God to make you aware of those that you pass as you are "on the way" to whatever you might be doing. Ask God to make you okay with interruptions from your own personal life. Ask God to help you care about those that are in need and never avoid them.

DAY 11: FRIDAY JANUARY 21ST

Prayer Point: A New Story

Scripture Reading: John 4:7-26, 39

Notes: Ask the Lord how you can engage with others in a way that helps open up conversations about Jesus. Pray that you would have discernment and wisdom about engaging other people. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you needs that you can meet in those people's lives.

DAY 12: SATURDAY JANUARY 22ND

Prayer Point: A New Imagination

Scripture Reading: Acts 10:9-16, 34-37

Notes: Pray for an open heart to see new things that God is doing in His church and in the world. Ask God to reveal where he's already at work. Ask God to break your heart for those who need Him and for the Holy Spirit to be evident in every way that you interact with others.

DAY 13: SUNDAY JANUARY 23RD

Prayer Point: A New Action

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 58:6-14

Notes: Ask God to give you a hunger for prayer and fasting. As you read Isaiah 58, ask God to give you ways that you can fulfill this verse in the community. Pray for salvation at RLC and and ask God for strategic partnerships among the body of Christ to fulfill his commands.

DAY 14: MONDAY JANUARY 24TH

Prayer Point: A New Hope

Scripture Reading: Revelation 21:1-5

Notes: Ask God to give you a renewed hope again. Repent for the areas that you've lost hope. Pray for our church and for the Church in America and the world. Pray for the kingdom of God to come to our country.

WEEK 3: DO A NEW THING IN OUR WORLD

DAY 15: TUESDAY JANUARY 25TH

Prayer Point: Praying for the Persecuted Scripture Reading: II Corinthians 12:9-10

Notes: Pray for the persecuted Christ followers around the world. Pray that they would encounter the sufficiency of God's grace like never before. Pray that persecutors would stop and accept Jesus like Saul did. Ask God to tear down the systems, regimes, empires, and beliefs that allow this persecution to exist.

DAY 16: WEDNESDAY JANUARY 26TH

Prayer Point: Praying for the Unreached

Scripture Reading: Matthew 24:14; Revelation 7:9

Notes: Take a few minutes to intercede for the 3.2 billion people in 7,400 people groups who are unreached. Ask the Lord to call and send believers to cross barriers with the gospel. Pray boldly against the spiritual forces that keep people locked in darkness. Pray for our missions' partners around the world. Pray that the unreached would experience encounters with Jesus through dreams, visions, revelations, miracles and divine encounters.

DAY 17: THURSDAY JANUARY 27TH

Prayer Point: Praying for Laborers Scripture Reading: Matthew 9:36-38

Pray that God would send more laborers to join the ministry teams of RLC. Take some time to lift up our Pastors, Elders and all our leadership teams. Pray that God would bring renewed strength and motivation to those who need refilling. Pray for marriages, families and good health for all those who work for the kingdom.

DAY 18: FRIDAY JANUARY 28TH

Prayer Point: Praying for the Poor

Scripture Reading: Matthew 25:34-40

Notes: Pray for the millions of people facing food insecurity that they will eat daily. Ask God that our heart breaks for those without the basic needs that are needed to live and that we would be a solution to the problem in our city and world. Pray for THE church of Jesus Christ

and that His people would be a people that embrace, advocate and care for the global poor.

DAY 19: SATURDAY, JANUARY 29TH

Prayer Point: Praying for Children and Students

Scripture Reading: Matthew 19:13-15

Notes: Ask the Lord to bring revival among children and teenagers in our church and in our world. Ask for sparks of the Holy Spirit to create new movements of young people experiencing revival even in the world's darkest places. As God to provide safety and protection for children around the world from predators, traffickers, abusers, exploiters and any who would do them harm.

DAY 20: SUNDAY JANUARY 30TH

Prayer Point: Praying for Healing Scripture Reading: James 5:14-16

Notes: Take time to pray for the sick that you know and you don't know. Pray specifically for those who might be sick as a result of this pandemic. Pray for spiritual unity amongst God's people regarding all of the Covid related issues. Pray for mental and emotional healing for those who are in need.

DAY 21: MONDAY JANUARY 31ST

Prayer Point: Praying for Unity

Scripture Reading: Matthew 28:19-20, Acts 1:8

Notes: Pray for Global unity in God's church. Ask God that movements and denominations would serve one another as the body of Christ. Pray that the global Christian movement would continue to grow through healthy discipleship, church planting, congregations and missionary vibrancy. Lastly, pray all the same things for Revival Life Church. That God would allow people to experience the fullness of the Holy Spirit, and that we would remain rooted in God's word.
